Things to Do

Smithsonian's National Zoo

Go wild with pandas, lions and elephants at the Smithsonian's National Zoo. A short walk from the Marriott Wardman Park, the zoo is open daily from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and free of charge.

Rock Creek Park

An oasis in the city, this 1,754-acre park offers miles of trails to walk or bike.

National Mall & Monuments

Explore the Lincoln Memorial, Washington Monument, White House, Capitol Building, WWII Memorial and much more.

Newseum

An interactive museum that promotes free expression and the First Amendment, while tracing the evolution of communication. Open 9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Monday to Saturday and 10:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. on Sunday.

Smithsonian Museums

19 museums and galleries with free admission, including the National Air & Space Museum, African American History and Culture Museum, Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden.

Washington National Cathedral

The sixth largest in the world, the National Cathedral offers beautiful gardens, flying buttresses and glass-stained windows. The Gothic style cathedral offers numerous tours featuring its stunning architecture.

Kid-Friendly Activities

Albert Einstein Planetarium

"Dino Summer" at the National Zoo

View an experiential theater production featuring a larger-than-life cast of dinosaur puppets or visit the outdoor exhibit of six massive animatronic dinosaurs that move and roar. The live production, "Earth's Dinosaur Zoo Live" performs 30-min shows at 10:30 a.m., 1:30 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. Open Tuesday to Sunday through August 31st.

International Spy Museum

An interactive museum featuring the largest collection of international espionage artifacts currently on public display. Open daily from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

National Building Museum

The Building Zone at the National Building Museum gives a hands-on introduction to the building arts for children ages 2-6. They can shop at a hardware store, build a tower, read books, play with construction trucks, and explore the Project Playhouse. It's open 10-4, Monday through Saturday, and 11-4 on Sundays.

Tidal Basin Paddle Boats

Paddle your way around the Tidal Basin and get a unique view of the Thomas Jefferson memorial in a swan boat or paddle boat. Open daily from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., weather permitting.

U.S. Botanic Garden

The U.S. Botanic Garden features a seasonal Children's Garden that allows kids to get hands-on experience using gardening tools and watering cans. Open daily from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m., 365 days a year. Admission is free.
